1. What makes something fantasy?
2. What are some examples of some fantasy stories that we have read?
 - a. Do you know of any fantasy stories outside of our reading book?
3. We see that the title of this story is “If the Shoe Fits,” what can we infer or guess the story might be about?
 - a. Why might you think that?
4. What is the reason that Zoey is not allowed to attend the party?
5. Why might her brother have created this problem for her?
6. How can we know that this is fantasy from what we see on this page?
7. What did Zoey’s friend do to show he cared?
8. What tells us that Kwan’s story will be different from Zoey’s?
9. How can we tell that Kwan’s story is fantasy?
10. How does Kwan’s sisters feel about her?

By writing down questions that I will have for the students, I am able to deduce what I will be giving them in terms of value in the lesson.
